This is my favorite USS Colahan photo. The ship is plowing a blue sea within sight of Hawaii's Diamond Head. Unlike photos showing the Colahan moored or docked in port, this one places her in action, with bow waves and a trailing wake as she maneuvers. The photo was taken in 1963 and it now introduces the Colahan on DestroyersOnline.com. Three years later the Navy would sink her as a target ship 40 miles southwest of San Diego. "The Japs couldn't sink her, so the U.S. Navy did it," commented a Colahan veteran sourly. True. She won 13 battle stars in her 23-year history and was never even dented by her enemies. — Jackson Sellers, March 2005
